### Coronavirus Update as at 11th March - Please Read

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York have made the following decision:

'It is our view, in light of the continued increase of Covid-19 cases in the United Kingdom, that it is now necessary to suspend the administration of the chalice as well as physical contact during the sharing of the peace, blessing or "laying on of hands".'

The use of individual cups is not lawful in the Church of England and so we will just be receiving the bread at Holy Communion although the president will also receive the wine. Whoever is presiding will continue to use hand gel before and after consecrating the elements.

In sharing the peace we will continue to use the British Sign Language version.
